2016 in Review

We have had a very busy year. We started out getting all new library shelves, furniture and flooring. We then changed the layout of our computer room, upgraded the 3 patron computers, desk computer, and copier machine. We have expanded our services to include a disc repair machine, DVD's, and Keurig. We put out the word during the summer we wanted to offer DVD's and were donated 483 within the next couple of months.

We have seen great growth in the usage of the library this year. And of course, we hope to continue seeing growth so that we can plan seriously for a larger library.

The following stats won't include the next 2 days of information, but close enough.

During 2016 we had 9,747 people in our doors, issued 296 new cards, added 1,613 new books, checked out 12,694 books and 235 DVD's. There were 1,032 computer uses.

Besides the 483 DVD's, we have 10,756 books in our physical collection. We also offer e-books through Overdrive Consortium, which broadens our collection to over 40K.

We are constantly looking for new program ideas, book suggestions, etc to better serve the community's needs. Just let us know how we can serve you better.
