The first week of March is National Ghostwriters Week. What is a ghost writer? According to<u>Dictionary.com</u>, a ghost writer is a person who writes books, articles, etc. for another person who is named or presumed to be the author.

Ghostwriters are employed by fiction publishers for several reasons. In some cases, publishers use ghostwriters to increase the number of books that can be published each year by a well-known, highly marketable author. Ghostwriters are mostly used to pen fiction works for well-known, "name" authors in genres such as detective fiction, mysteries, and teen fiction.

Additionally, publishers use ghostwriters to write new books for established series where the 'author' is a <u>pseudonym</u>. For example, the purported authors of the <u>Nancy Drew</u> and <u>Hardy Boys</u> mysteries, "Carolyn Keene" and "Franklin W. Dixon", respectively, are actually pseudonyms for a series of ghostwriters who write books in the same style using a template of basic information about the book's characters and their fictional universe (names, dates, speech patterns), and about the tone and style that are expected in the book.

Sorry if I burst your bubble over the Nancy Drew and Hardy Boy books. :o)
