E-Books are also now available.
Download your choices on your reader, and magically 2 weeks later they disappear off your device. If there isn't anyone waiting on the book, you may renew once.

This service will be FREE to you. FYI though, anyone with expired cards, overdue books, or fines will not be able to use this service until those items are corrected.

Dana Conner N.D. C.N.H.P. is presenting a program on "Staying Well".


She teaches how to "restore your health naturally" and will be talking about her practice, herbs, nutritional counseling, homeopathy, and iridology.

March 31 @ 9:30: The Last Child by John Hart




